1945: CHARTER OF THE UNITED NATIONS

WE THE PEOPLES OF THE UNITED NATIONS ARE DETER-MINED

to save succeeding generations from the scourge of war, which twice in our lifetime has brought untold sorrow to mankind, and

to reaffirm faith in fundamental human rights, in the dignity and worth of the human person, in the equal rights of men and women and of nations large and small, and

to establish conditions under which justice and respect for the obligations arising from treaties and other sources of international law can be maintained, and

to promote social progress and better standards of life in larger freedom,

AND FOR THESE ENDS

to practice tolerance and live together in peace with one another as good neighbours, and

to unite our strength to maintain international peace and security, and

to ensure, by the acceptance of principles and the institution of methods, that armed force shall not be used, save in the common interest, and

to employ international machinery for the promotion of the economic and social advancement of all peoples.

1948: UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS

A common standard of achievement for all peoples and all nations, to the end that every individual and every organ of society, keeping this Declaration constantly in mind, shall strive by teaching and education to promote respect for these rights and freedoms and by progressive measures, national and international, to secure their universal and effective recognition and observance, both among the peoples of Member States themselves and among the peoples of territories under their jurisdiction.

Sustainable development is development that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs.












AGENDA 2030 FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

This Agenda is a plan of action for people, planet and prosperity. It also seeks to strengthen universal peace in larger freedom. All countries and all stakeholders, acting in collaborative partnership, will implement this plan. We are determined to take the bold and transformative steps which are urgently needed to shift the world onto a sustainable and resilient path. As we embark on this collective journey, we pledge that no one will be left behind. The 17 Sustainable Development Goals and 169 targets demonstrate the scale and ambition of this new universal Agenda. They are integrated and indivisible and balance the three dimensions of sustainable development: the economic, social and environmental.



PARIS AGREEMENT ON CLIMATE CHANGE

The Paris Agreement's central aim is to strengthen the global response to the threat of climate change by keeping a global temperature rise this century well below 2 degrees Celsius above pre-industrial levels and to pursue efforts to limit the temperature increase even further to 1.5 degrees Celsius. Additionally, the agreement aims to strengthen the ability of countries to deal with the impacts of climate change.



NEW URBAN AGENDA

By readdressing the way cities and human settlements are planned, designed, financed, developed, governed and managed, the New Urban Agenda will help to end poverty and hunger in all its forms and dimensions; reduce inequalities; promote sustained, inclusive and sustainable economic growth; achieve gender equality and the empowerment of all women and girls in order to fully harness their vital contribution to sustainable development; improve human health and well-being; foster resilience; and protect the environment.





GLOBAL COMPACT

The vision of the UN Global Compact is to create a sustainable and inclusive global economy that delivers lasting benefits to people, communities and markets.

To make this happen, the UN Global Compact expects companies to:

- do business responsibly by aligning their strategies and operations with the 'Ten Principles on Human Rights', labour, environment and anti-corruption; and
- take strategic actions to advance broader societal goals, such as the UN Sustainable Development Goals, with an emphasis on collaboration and innovation.

UN GUIDING PRINCIPLES ON BUSINESS & HUMAN RIGHTS

The Special Representative, John Ruggie, presented a framework to the Human Rights Council in June 2008. The "Protect, Respect and Remedy" Framework rests on three pillars:

- the state duty to protect against human rights abuses by third parties, including business, through appropriate policies, regulation, and adjudication;
- the corporate responsibility to respect human rights, which means to act with due diligence to avoid infringing on the rights of others and to address adverse impacts that occur;
- and greater access by victims to effective remedy, both judicial and non-judicial.








The five speakers who presented their actions, based on the SDGs, did this in a charming, enthusiastic and motivating way. They inspired me, as well as the employees of the city of Genk.







CELEBRATING UNITED NATIONS DAY, 24 OCTOBER, TOUR & TAXIS, BRUSSELS

CIFAL Flanders hosted - in close collaboration with the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR), the Global Science, Technology & Innovation Conferences (G-STIC), the United Nations Regional Information Centre (UNRIC) and with support of the Flemish Institute for Technological Research (VITO) and Brussels Airport - a High-Level Colloquium and United Nations Marketplace celebrating the 72nd anniversary of the United Nations. This year's edition was held in the context of the Global Science, Technology & Innovation Conferences. More than 200 participants attended the High-Level Colloquium and visited the UN Marketplace.







SDGS IN PRACTICE , 19 SEPTEMBER, UTRECHT

Since the MDGs were transformed into SDGs, Nedworc is active in information and discussion of the meaning that "SDG goals and targets" have for the concrete work of consultants in development cooperation.
